

FROM THE Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

I would like to give you an update on our parish and a summary of things that occurred during the fiscal year of July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018.

The mission of our parish is: "Love God, Love Others and Make Disciples". More than a catchy phrase, this statement summarizes what we strive and aim to be as followers of Jesus Christ, to not just GO to Church, but to BE the Church!



Some ways that we continue to stress is to make our "Weekend Experience" the best that it can possibly be. We are emphasizing the "3M's".... Ministry, Message and Music. Ministry as in creating a sense of warm hospitality among all the ministries on the weekends. From greeters, ushers and everyone in the pews. We are all called to be ministers of hospitality not just to those people that we already know, but especially to those who are visiting us as guests.

Another "M" is the message or the homily at Mass. During this past year, we have started our message series. The message series are a series of homilies that are coordinated among the clergy so that the entire parish can hear the same message. Usually they are built around a theme and incorporate the Sunday readings. One of the goals of the message series is to coordinate the weekend message with the small group discussions throughout the week. The third "M" is music. We are blest to have the talent of Dr. Gonzalo and our members of the music ministry. Oftentimes, music is an area where many parishes struggle. We are blest to have great music and musicians here. But we strive always to be better. We are working on ways to enhance the participation of the congregation more in the singing of hymns and music at Mass.

One major way that we have striven to enhance the weekend experience is through the use of our "big screens" at Mass. The screens allow us to have the words to the songs and the responses and prayers at Mass available to all in the church to see. This is especially helpful to those who are joining us for the first time, or may be unfamiliar with the responses and prayers at Mass.

Our church building was constructed in 2002. As the building turns 16 this year, some major maintenance items need to take place. Due to a major leak, the flat roof over the front entrance to the church needs to be replaced. This project started during the 2017-18 FY and will conclude in the 2018-19 FY. A future need that has been identified is the replacement of the flooring in the church. Plans call for a replacement of the carpet in the church with porcelain tile. In order to replace the flooring in the church, it will be necessary in the future to do this project during the summer months. It is expected that this could take several months, as all the pews will need to be moved around as the flooring is replaced. In order to do this project, we have determined that the Parish Hall could be utilized to accommodate the smaller Mass attendance numbers during the summer. Our focus on the upcoming year is to get the Parish Hall ready for this to occur. The Hall was painted and new flooring and 700 new chairs were ordered to replace the ones we had since 1991. We are also making plans to add large projection screens in the Parish Hall and to replace the sound system, so that the "weekend experience" can continue in the Parish Hall for Masses and others activities. Our meeting rooms are also getting a new configuration to accommodate and facilitate small group discussion.

This year, we hosted two "hunger challenges". These are days when hundreds of parishioners come together in the parish hall and pack food which is then sent to areas in our world that are most in need. Our first hunger challenge was the "Three Kings" Hunger Challenge in January where we packed 80,000 meals. It was a great success. We also held another hunger challenge in June.... the School's Out Hunger Challenge in which 40,000 meals were packed and sent to those in need. The parish purchases the supplies, and parishioners pack and box the food. Once again, it is through the generosity of parishioners that allows us to participate in this very important mission of the church to feed the poor.

During Lent, we added the "Mercy Bag" project. Items and supplies for the homeless were collected during Lent and then assembled into 2-gallon zip lock bags that could be given to a homeless person in our travels around our area.

During the Spring, we once again welcomed Fr. Erick Gruloos, the pastor of San Miguel, our Sister Parish in Guatemala to St. Peter. He spoke at all the weekend Masses and the second collection was taken to help our sister parish. The next month, a group from St. Peter travelled to San Miguel to visit and see the many projects that we have collaborated with over the past ten years.

The model that we are using at St. Peter is called "Rebuilt". Rebuilt is a church renewal program that began at Church of the Nativity in Timonium, Maryland. We are "adapting" it here at St. Peter to fit the unique needs of our parish. The emphasis of Rebuilt is to make Church matter and to reach out to the unchurched. To form members into disciples, and to empower disciples to invite the unchurched into a relationship with Christ. This spring, the parish clergy and staff travelled to Church of the Nativity to attend the Rebuilt Conference. If you would like a copy of the book, "Rebuilt", we have copies available.

These are but some of the ways that we are striving to live out our mission to "Love God, Love Others and Make Disciples!" Many more things occur every day in which disciples are formed and we serve and participate in the mission and ministry of the church. I would encourage you to attend Mass frequently, even daily Mass. To join a small group to grow deeper in your faith, to get involved in a ministry to share your talent with others and finally....to invite a friend, neighbor, coworker or family member to come to Mass with you. By doing these things, our lives are transformed and enhanced as we take up our Lord's challenge to be his disciples and to share the Good News to all.

I invite you to peruse through these pages and see some of the great things happening at St. Peter.





In a review of revenues and expenses for the 2018 fiscal year compared to the previous year, revenues were significantly higher (10%) while expenses were only slightly less (3%). The additional revenues were primarily due to unrestricted donations from 5 parishioners totaling \$216,700. Offertory contributions reflect a slight increase of 2%. Large expenditures during this fiscal year included the large screens and TV's in the church as well as the first payment to replace the flat roof on the church. The two loans that we have with the Diocese decreased by almost \$200,000. The school loan is expected to be paid off in the next twelve months. We continue to commit ourselves to being excellent stewards of your generosity.



Rev. Donald T. Finney *Pastor*

Fr. Don Finney was born in Omaha, NE. He attended the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA and graduated with a degree in History. He taught U.S. History, World History, Theology and

was Assistant Headmaster at Marianapolis Preparatory School in Thompson, CT. He studied for the priesthood at St. John's Seminary in Brighton, MA and was ordained to the priesthood on May 28, 1994 at St. Patrick Cathedral in Norwich, CT. Fr. Don has served at St. Louis Parish in Webster, MA, the Cathedral of St. Ignatius Loyola in Palm Beach Gardens, FL and St. Lucie Parish in Port St. Lucie, FL. In April 2003 Fr. 




Rev. Wesler Hilaire *Parochial Vicar*

Layne Behncke is the Director of Youth Ministry and Confirmation. She was raised in Palm Harbor, FL with her two older


