



At St. Vincent de Paul, we believe that the working poor, children, elderly, homeless, sick, disabled and other disadvantaged members of our community should have a reliable source to assist them in times of a temporary financial emergency to ensure that their most essential needs are met. Every year, we help hundreds of individuals and families on the verge of eviction and homelessness and those who are unable to pay for other essentials (i.e., electricity, water, vehicle needs, food, clothing, etc.) due to unforeseen circumstances. There are many reasons why and it can be just one unexpected hardship that puts them in a hole from which they can't recover without the assistance of organizations like St. Vincent de Paul.

On September 30, 2025, we completed another fiscal year of providing emergency financial assistance to low-income individuals and families in Jupiter and our surrounding communities. We set a record high for the number of approved cases and amount of financial assistance provided during our fiscal year 2025.

More than 50% of our assistance has been directed toward our **Homeless Prevention Program.** We prevented 112 households from becoming homeless during fiscal year 2025 by assisting with rents and mortgages. We provided 264 hotel nights in fiscal year 2025 to families mostly transitioning to more permanent housing solutions through one our partners. We kept the lights on and water flowing in 91 households during fiscal year 2025. We provided gift cards to the homeless and referred them to agencies better equipped to handle their needs. Administrative costs are kept to a minimum.

We are a group of 24 volunteers who dedicate our time and talents to help people in our local community when they have nowhere else to turn. Our volunteers participate on a weekly phone duty assignment using one of our two dedicated mobile phones (English and Spanish), taking calls from people in need and presenting their needs to our four board members for review. Most of the process is done virtually through phone, text and email correspondence. We typically dispense financial assistance within 24-48 hours of receiving the call from the person in-need and sometimes within just a few hours if the case is urgent. We do not have any employees, nor do we own or rent any facilities or vehicles.
